Dr. Joe Pace is a nationally known speaker who conducts seminars and workshops in areas of school management, faculty development, student retention, psychology, and motivation. He has instructed thousands of college-level students in the areas of psychology, personal development, and business administration.


He has earned a doctorate in education, a masters degree in psychological counseling, and a bachelors degree in business administration. His doctoral dissertation and 20 years of research, concerning success concepts and innovative student retention and persistence techniques, have been the sources for his authoring numerous articles and lecturing internationally.

Dr. Pace, psychologist and former college president, currently serves as the National and International Managing Partner of the Education Initiative for The Pacific Institute. He is the creator of the *Success Strategies for Effective Schools* program which has been implemented worldwide by The Pacific Institute. He is also an educational and psychological consultant for various schools, colleges and organizations throughout the United States and Canada. From 1974 to 1988, he was Chairman of the Board and President of Prospect Hall College in Hollywood, Florida. Before joining Prospect Hall College, he was the Director at Fort Lauderdale University, and prior to relocating to Florida, he served as the Director of Jamestown Business College in Jamestown, New York.

Dr. Pace was appointed by the Governor of Florida to the Florida State Department of Education's nine-member licensing board for private schools, serving on the board for ten years, and elected chairman twice. Additionally, he is the former president of the Florida Association of Postsecondary Schools and Colleges.

On a national level, Dr. Pace recently served as Commissioner of the Accrediting Council for Independent Colleges and Schools in Washington, DC. He served on the Executive Committee of the Council and also on the Board of Directors of the Association of Independent Colleges and Schools, currently known as the Career College Association (CCA).

Dr. Pace has been involved in education for over thirty years.
